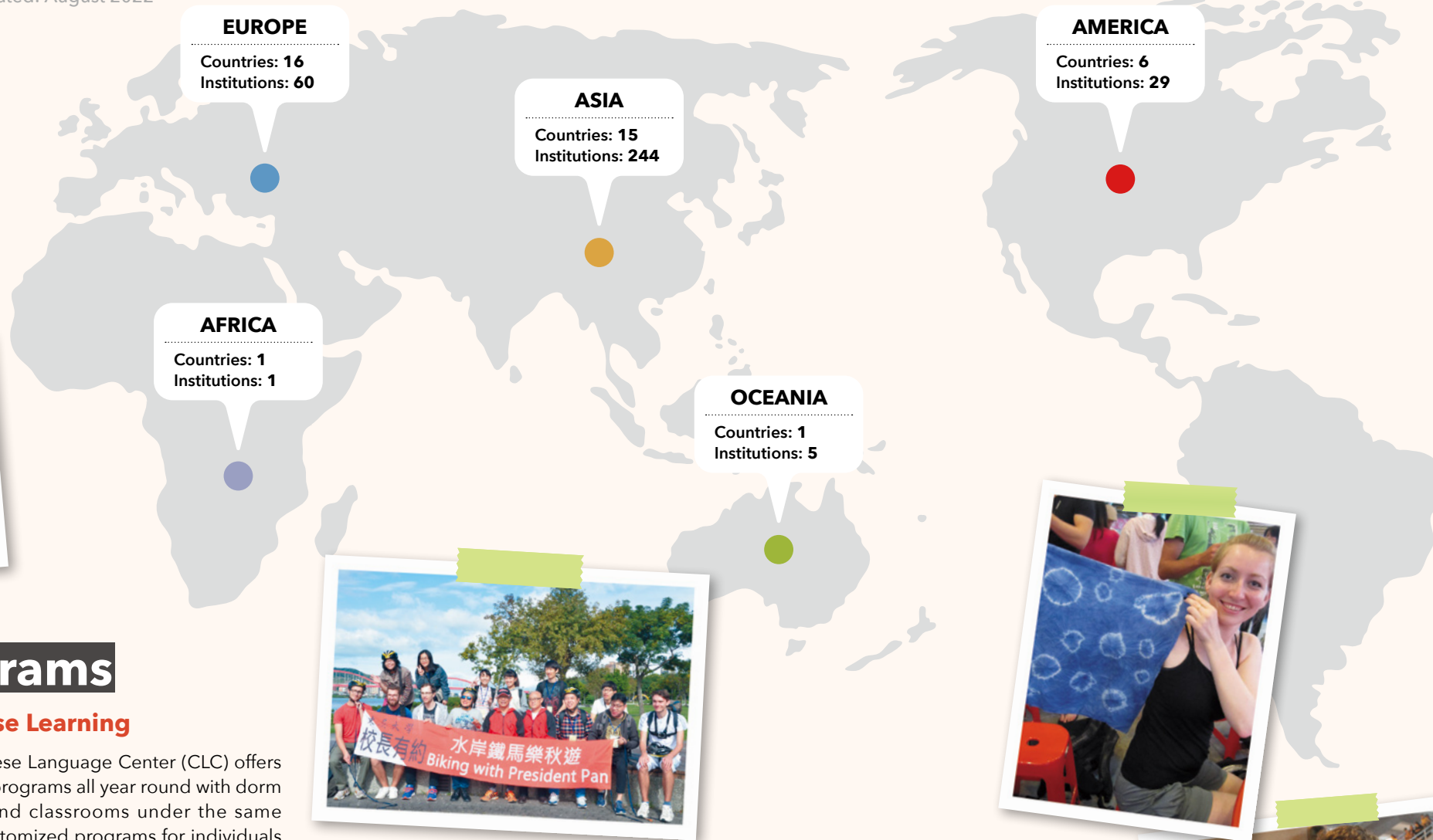

## About Soochow University

Soochow University was founded in 1900 at Suzhou by the Methodist Church as the first western-style university in China, and reestablished by alumni in 1951 in Taipei as the first private university in Taiwan.



## About Chinese Language Center

The Chinese Language Center (CLC) of Soochow University (SCU) provides a unique Chinese learning experience in Taiwan as our classrooms and dormroom are placed under one roof. Our scenic location on a hillside offers great views of the nearby creek, as well as the world-renowned National Palace Museum. The world's largest collection of Chinese art is only 20-minute walk away. The hustle and bustle of Taipei city life, Shilin night market is only a 10-minute bus ride away. Learners at the CLC have easy access to university library, gym, church, post office, student clubs and food court. Also available are airport pick up and drop offs, accommodation, free Wi-Fi, resident assistants, learning partners, orientation sessions, graduation ceremonies and accident insurance.



## Quarter Programs

Chinese Language Center (CLC) offers 4 quarter programs each year, with 6 levels of classes for beginning, intermediate, and advanced learners. Along with cultural activities, our program allows students to experience and explore Taiwanese culture. Class hours are 3 hours a day, 5 days a week, Monday through Friday.

### Language Class

### Seminar

Speeches by guest speakers on Taiwanese history, culture and history. Previous seminars include "International Relations among E. Asia" by Professor from Department of Sociology, Soochow University, and "Relations among China, America, and Taiwan" by Political Officer from AIT.



### Field Trip

One to three days of culture experience trips, for example, visit to the Hot Spring Museum in Beitou, visit to Kuo Yuan Ye Museum of Cake and Pastry to make pineapple cake, and white water rafting.

### Panel

## Chinese Camps

A 3-week Sumer Camp is offered every year in August, and a Winter Camp in March may also be added. The camp includes Chinese language courses in the morning, cultural activities in the afternoon, and weekly field trips to historical and cultural sites in northern Taiwan.

### Living Chinese

Learn how to use Chinese in daily life in different scenarios, for example, shopping, asking for directions, and taking public transportations.

### Field Trips
